Focus of the week: Living in the wider world

Across the next half term, the PHSE curriculum is 'Living in the Wider World'. This gives us chance to discuss protected characteristics such as race, religion and belief. This helps us to live peacefully in our local and wider communities.

The ways school helps

Assemblies and lessons provide a safe space for pupils to consider questions like

- What groups and communities am I part of?
- What is the difference between my local British communities and global communities?
