Focus of the week: Maths

Crosslee children love maths. Here are some ideas to give you a flavour of why this is!

Early counting

It's really important to learn facts very well. Our reception children learn their facts to 10 in many ways - both with their teachers and also in their play. They use counters, ten-frames, bottle tops - you name it, they can do maths with it! We're sure they impress you as parents at home too!

Learning walk

Leaders at Crosslee frequently visit classrooms to see how learning is getting on. On one such recent learning walk, it was obvious how much Crosslee children enjoy maths. Their confidence has grown because of the good teaching they get.

Times tables

An essential part of primary school education is learning times tables facts so they are instantly known. Children should know all their tables facts to 12 x 12 by the end of year 4. Children in Year 3 and 4 work very hard for a test at the end of Year 4, which gets them ready for Year 5 and 6.

Reasoning

'Maths no Problem' lessons have been in place for about a year. These lessons are structured to make sure each child has chance to talk through their understanding. This helps them grow in confidence and has had a great impact through the school.
